2017 LEARNER ANALYTICS INSTITUTE

This LAI was hosted by the University of Pretoria on the 11th of September. There were 23 delegates in attendance from 12 different institutions across the country.

WHAT WAS ON THE AGENDA?

Most HE institutions are moving towards data-driven decision-making in support of their interventions aimed at improving student success. This one-day intensive workshop in learner analytics provided delegates with:

- practical skills in Excel and,
- Tableau Software using higher education data

Themes for the workshop included:

- Problem identification and evaluation frameworks
- Pre-processing and data analysis (data integrity)
- Creating data driven dashboards with Tableau Software and PowerBI (reporting visualization)
- Creating an evaluative design through data analysis
