The 25th Annual Conference of the Southern African Association for Institutional Research (SAAIR) was no exception.

Hosted by the Durban University of Technology on the eastern seaboard of South Africa (13-15 November 2018) with three pre-conference workshops on 12 November at the DUT Conference Centre, Ritson Campus. This conference theme was, *Re-imagining our universities, the role and impact of institutional research in times of disruption*. *One hundred forty-four delegates* from *42 institutions* attended in 2018.

This theme is a natural progression from the 2016 and 2017 conference themes, Considering the #FeesMustFall campaigns & New opportunities for Southern African Higher Education Institutional Research and Rethinking university engagement in Africa. The 2018 conference theme centred on the uptake of Higher Education (HE) research, through HE scholarly outputs, including grey literature in the form of policy documents and reports which is often produced with Institutional Research.

The delegates were warmly welcomed by Prof Sibusiso Moyo, Deputy Vice-Chancellor: Research, Innovation and Engagement, Durban University of Technology. She spoke passionately abuout creating enabling environments for people to flourish in Higher Education Institutions.

SAAIR is involved in many initiatives to promote capacity development in the Higher Education sector in Southern Africa. One such initiative, *The scope, synergy and uptake of research into higher education in Southern Africa*, was show-cased at the conference with eight papers pertaining to the sstudy presented. This project pairs emerging researchers with established researchers on joint research projects.
