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Conceptual clarification

Self-directed learning involves students who identify their learning needs, learning outcomes, learning resources, learning strategies and conduct self-assessment, with minimal lecturer involvement (Knowles, 1975)



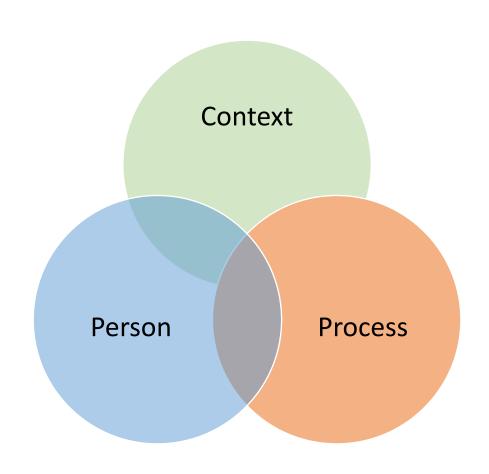

 Students seemed to lack self-directed learning and relied on lecturers for learning.

o Students were probably underutilising institutional resources like Blackboard and counselling unit, to support learning.

 H₁ There is an association between self-directed learning and institutional resources.

Self-directed learning results

I can decide on my own learning strategy.	81%

Institutional resources results

STATEMENT	AGREE	DISAGREE
My institution's online classroom helps me learn on my own.	74 %	
At my institution, I can access financial support that helps me learn.	73%	
My institution cannot provide emotional support I need.		54%

Findings

 Many students were intrinsically motivated and could identify their learning needs, as well as learning strategies.

 Most students were satisfied with financial aid, accommodation and online learning services.

Students were concerned about inadequate computers,
 Wi-Fi and counselling services.
