The 26th Annual Conference of the Southern African Association for Institutional Research (SAAIR) is fundamental in supporting the aims of the association. The theme for the 2019 SAAIR Conference is *Institutional Research as the X Factor for Efficiency and Effectiveness in Higher Education Institutions* and is scheduled to take place on 4 to 7 November 2019 at Tshwane University of Technology (TUT), Mbombela (Nelspruit) Campus, in Mpumalanga, South Africa.

Institutional Researchers have become the "X-factor" towards attaining institutional effectiveness, efficiency and sustainability. The "X-factor" includes the core elements, skills and knowledge associated with IR, as well as the more elusive, intangible factors, which make certain Institutional Research Professionals (IRPs) major positive influencers and change agents. Your particular "X-factor" may relate to planning, marketing and recruitment, financial management, quality assurance, technology/artificial intelligence, student retention, academic staff development, as well as curriculum and pedagogy in order to meet quality standards or various combinations of these. Association for Institutional Research Forum was held on 27-31 May 2019 at the Denver Convention Centre, Denver, Colorado, USA

The Association for Institutional Research Forum was held on 27-31 May 2019 at the Denver Convention Centre, **Denver, Colorado, USA**. Our very own, Deputy-President, Dr. Mxolisi Masango was in attendance representing IR in Southern Africa.



Very insightful conference covered a range of topics from Big Data to Institutional Effectiveness, Predictive Analytics, Ethical Use of Data, Student Success, Student Engagement, and the use of GIS in student success, and University Rankings, to mention just a few. Almost 2000 delegates from 30 countries were in attendance at this well organised the conference made up of 300 sessions, described by Mxolisi as a "wow" event and who returned home with a host new ideas to inspire SAAIR for future practice.

Learner Analytics Special Interest Group (SIG) lauched at the Learner Analytics Foundations & Institute

The Southern African Association for Institutional Research (SAAIR) launched the Learning Analytics Special Interest Group (SIG) on 18 March 2019. The launch took place as part of SAAIR's Learner Analytics workshop hosted by the University of South Africa (UNISA), specifically the portfolio Strategy, Risk & Advisory Services (Prof Khehla Ndlovu) with its Directorate for Institutional Research and Business Intelligence (Dr Matseliso Molapo). The event hosted some of the giants in South African Higher Education such as Prof Narend Baijnath, Council for Higher Education, Prof Paul Prinsloo, Unisa and Prof Alan Amory, SAIDE, all expertly organised and facilitated by Dr Angelo Fynn and his team at Unisa, as well as SAAIR under the leadership of Dr Elizabeth Archer.

There has been immense investment in learning analytics by the Department of Higher Education and Training as well as the Kresge Foundation through the Siyaphumalela Project. These investments are already bearing fruit, but it is still fragmented with pockets of excellence, resources and skills. The **Learning Analytics SIG** was borne out of the need to marry the modern science and technology of Learning Analytics with the power of Ubuntu moving beyond boundaries and silos such as private vs public higher education, South Africa vs neighbouring countries, hard scientist, support practitioners, lecturers, ethicists, policy and strategy experts.

The emphasis is on collectively improving South African Higher Education Analytics as a sector, beyond perceived institutional rivalries. The maturation will have specific milestone events; these include the 2019 SAAIR conference, a **National Learner Analytics Event in 2020**, all building

up to a robust, competitive bid to host the 12th International Learning Analytics and Knowledge (LAK) Conference in South Africa. This will represent a major victory for Africa as a whole as the event has never been hosted on the continent; promising an influx of more than 1000 participants. It is also fitting that the bid-process will be led by Prof Paul Prinsloo, the widely acknowledged leading African researcher in Learner Analytics Ethics, and previous recipient of the best paper award at LAK...

HEMIS Foundations & Institute 2019




The theme for the Foundation was Transforming IR Data into Actionable Strategic Insights
