Message from the President

Reflecting on Our Journey to Date

Our team began with a clear and deliberate commitment to serve as a consultative and inclusive ExCo, rooted in the values and mission of SAAIR. Throughout this period, we have actively engaged with members, institutional partners, higher education leaders, researchers, sponsors, and emerging voices in the higher education community to ensure that our actions are informed, responsive, and aligned with the evolving needs of our diverse academic and professional community. We have had the opportunity to:

- Engage key sponsors and strategic allies in thoughtful discussions on mutual value creation.
- Analyse responses from the SAAIR Member Satisfaction Survey. We appreciate those who shared their voice with us.
- Establish and enhance internal databases to better track membership insights, institutional participation, strategic partnerships, and engagement trends.
- Strengthen regional representation by actively engaging institutions and individuals across the sector, with particular emphasis on broadening participation in the Sub-Saharan region.

Collective Priorities

Our members expressed a strong desire for:

- A more inclusive and dual-stream approach that supports both practitioners and academic researchers.
- Practical, hands-on training and capacity-building opportunities integrated into SAAIR events to strengthen skills and application.
- An increase in webinars and digital engagements that are contextually relevant and responsive to member's evolving needs.
- A clarified and strengthened research agenda for SAAIR, with an emphasis on practiceled contributions that inform and advance the field.
- A stronger focus on policy influence, positioning SAAIR as a key contributor to strategic dialogue in higher education.
- Deepened and more strategic partnerships with local and international institutions to expand reach and ensure long-term sustainability.

These insights have informed our strategic approach moving forward.

Introducing the SAAIR Strategic Framework: DISCO

We are proud to introduce the SAAIR 2025–2026 Strategic Framework, named DISCO, symbolising our commitment to cultivating rhythm, coherence, and excellence across our collective efforts. This framework captures the core pillars that will shape our collective direction and aspirations:

- **D Data-Driven**: Fostering a culture where analytics and evidence are central to informed decision-making and active member engagement across the higher education landscape.
- I Impact and Sustainability: Designing initiatives that deliver measurable outcomes and lasting value, ensuring continuity and relevance beyond short-term cycles.
- **S Strategy and Policy Influence**: Playing a meaningful role in shaping institutional strategies and contributing to national and regional policy discussions.
- C Capacity and Professional Development: Equipping members through targeted, skills-based initiatives that strengthen expertise, advance scholarship, and build leadership—while exploring the potential for formal or occupational qualifications in related fields.
- O Optimisation and Innovation: Equipping members through targeted, skills-based initiatives that strengthen expertise, advance scholarship, and build leadership.
 Embracing creative thinking, new approaches, and collaborative models to addressthe sector's evolving challenges and opportunities especially in relation to technology.

This framework will guide our activities, partnerships, and priorities as we work towards a stronger and more resilient SAAIR.

In 2024, 30% of our members had been part of the association for 5–10 years, while 45% had engaged with us for 2–4 years, reflecting both long-standing commitment and a growing influx of new voices. Notably, 17% have been loyal members for over a decade, underscoring the deep trust and enduring value they find in SAAIR. This is further affirmed by the fact that 85% of our members reported high satisfaction with their membership experience, and 70% said they would actively recommend SAAIR to colleagues—a clear signal of the association's relevance and impact.
